A strong, dynamic and enterprising Private Sector is a strategic necessity for national development and an integral part of a private sector led economy that will provide jobs, generate public revenue, and earn foreign exchange. MCAP will drive economic development by:-

- Implementing an award program for young innovators
- Providing support for small businesses
- Introducing a Young Entrepreneur's scheme
- •Encouraging and supporting retired person business opportunities
- Seeking to modernize and expand sand and aggregate mining industry
- Promoting the development of light manufacturing
- Providing incentive for the expansion of water industry for export
- •Targeting external companies to set up subsidiaries in Montserrat
- Seeking to establish a development fund



EDUCATION

Human resource is a primary asset which must be maximized to anticipate the demand of the labor market and facilitate the development of the desired skills, competencies and work attitudes of the residents of Montserrat. To meet this goal MCAP will:-

- Upgrade primary school curriculum to make information Technology Mandatory
- •Upgrade the Montserrat Secondary School curriculum and add computer graphics, 3D modeling and computer programming
- •Implement Education Management Systems
- Introduce teaching of Civics at all educational levels
- •Ensure that learning disabilities are detected early and interventions provided
- •Re-introduce Technical/Vocation courses at the MCC
- •Re-introduce and expand the teacher training program
- Introduce continued professional development for teachers
- Introduce a student revolving loan program



•Ensure that there is a structured Physical Education Program in the curriculum of schools.





HEALTH

An MCAP administration is committed to providing universal health care coverage for all by:-

- Strengthening the Health Sector Governance and services
- ·Constructing the New Hospital on existing site
- Identifying and equipping the hospital appropriately
- Creating linkages between Glendon and other hospitals
- Developing memoranda of understanding with relevant private sector health providers
- •Introducing Tele- Medicine in the delivery of health service

- Continuing and expanding the visiting specialist programme
- Promoting and making early detection programs for cancers more accessible and affordable
- Introducing National Health Insurance
- Implementing Mental Health Policy
- •Implementing a health professional development regime/programme for all levels of staff
- Developing an electronic patient medical record data base





LAND & HOUSING

- •Upgrade homes of families, living without basic sanitary facilities and safe drinking water




AGRICULTURE

MCAP will identify, promote and assist in implementing appropriate farming and fisheries technologies and systems to enable increased production off targeted import substitution crops and products by:-

- •Continuing to train farmers in modern techniques and integrating technology in food production
- •Implementing programs with the appropriate incentives to attract young persons into modern commercial agriculture

- •Introducing advance training in modern fishing techniques
- •Providing incentives to individual who wish to venture into HI- Tec agriculture and fishing
- •Facilitating expanded agricultural operations in more fertile areas.
- Providing necessary support to livestock farmers to increase production of local products
- •Building additional linkages between tourism and agriculture
- •Work with the Farmers' Association to provide a chilling facility for farmer's produce.
- •Commercializing the use of fruits such as mangoes, black berries, tamarinds and breadfruit
- Developing an Information Technology System to assist in harvesting forecasting



FISHERIES

The fisheries resources of Montserrat must be fully exploited to modernize the fishing industry by using advanced technology. We will achieve this by:-



- •Selecting groups of young fishers and offering them attachment/scholarships that will expose them to modern fishing techniques
- •Working to commercialize the fisheries industry
- Initiating a register of all fisher folks and their boats
- Strengthening fisher folk associations







TRADE

MCAP will seek to expand, improve and develop local products for export to improve incomes of local artisans. We will:-

- •Develop an online marketplace for Montserrat made products
- Appoint a Montserrat Trade Representative in the UK
- •Develop and implement "a "Made in Montserrat" Brand

- Attract manufacturing firms to set up franchise in Montserrat
- •Work with Standards Bureau to establish standards for some products

ENVIRONMENT

An MCAP government is committed to protecting the environment and its bio - diversity for future generations. We will :-

- •Develop and implement a comprehensive recycling system
- Provide duty free concession on electric cars
- Implement a comprehensive ocean governance regime
- •Continue to protect Montserrat's unique Bio-diversity
- Advocate the use of environmentally friendly materials in all areas of development
- Implement the Conservation & Environmental Management Act
- Update and implement the National Climate Change Adaption Policy
- •Encourage restoration of Historic Sites with government incentives
- •Update National Disaster Management Planning

- •Improving public spaces for the use of persons with disabilities
- Providing duty free concessions on all equipment and accessories for the elderly and persons with disabilities
- •Equipping community centers for use by students as after school activity

- •Developing and implementing a Montserrat Youth award for quality, innovation and recognition of youth work
- •Enhancing recreational facilities across the island

- •Giving National Recognition to our athletes to serve as a motivation for excellence
- •Developing closer bonds with British Sporting Bodies and local associations
- •Supporting youth representation at local and international levels
